Public Comments: Diane Lunsford – She said the Mayor's State of

the City address was well received. She stated there were a lot of positive and energetic things said and she looks forward to seeing a lot of those come true. She asked why wasn't an ethics violation filed against Councilman Antoine for the comment he made two meetings ago to Samuel Ibanez. Mrs. Lunsford stated the presentation from J & E Entertainment is a good idea. She wanted to know about the governing body's ward money and can they be accountable

for the \$4,000 that they are given a year.

Samuel Ibanez – stated people have ideas that should be heard. He stated there are millions of dollars slipping from our hands. There are

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teenagers out there with nothing to do. He hopes change is coming.

Dr. Beeler – stated he is very proud of the city and he can see the growth. He stated he has been in the city for a long time. Mr. Beeler stated he believes that if the governing body continues on the course that they are going they will have good success. He commended them on taking the first step and trying to work together and that makes him smile. He stated there was a clean-up held on the Southside a couple months ago and there was quite a bit of trash picked up. There were over 70 people out there helping. On June 29th there will be another clean-up and he encourages everyone that can to come out and participate.

Richard Turner – stated his home was broken into while he and his family were at church and some items were taken by 15 year old kids. Mr. Turner suggests the city have more programs for the youth. He stated he is here to offer any support or mentorship to the youth. He stated he has ideas and is willing to share them.

Approval of Minutes:

Councilwoman James made a Motion to Approve the Work Session Minutes and Regular Meeting minutes for June 3, 2019. It was seconded by Councilwoman Wells. Voting for the motion was unanimous.

Public Hearing:

Councilwoman James made a motion to recess the Regular Meeting and enter into a Public Hearing to receive comments on the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. It was seconded by Councilwoman Wells. Voting for the motion was unanimous.

Ken Thompson stated a balanced budget for FY2019-2020 has been presented to the governing body in the amount of \$26,921,004



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and the millage rate is currently proposed to remain the same at 16.743 mills which is tentative pending the receipt of the tax digest from the county later this summer. The budget will be available on the homepage of the city's website and will be updated as we proceed through the budget process. Updates to the cost of Health Insurance and Property & Casualty Insurance are being finalized and will be reflected in the Final Budget for approval by the governing body. Final adoption of the budget is scheduled for a Special Called meeting of the governing body on Thursday June 27, 2019 at 6:00 p.m.

Public Comments:

Councilwoman Bagley made a motion to close the Public Hearing and reconvene the Regular Meeting. It was seconded by Councilwoman James. Voting for the motion was unanimous.

Agenda Items:

Resolution Consenting To Airport South CID Expansion: Request was made consenting to expansion of Airport South Community Improvement District.

Councilwoman Wells made a motion to approve the Resolution. It was seconded by Councilwoman James. Voting for the motion was unanimous.

Resolution Providing for Abandonment of a Certain Road:

Request was made providing for abandonment of a certain road; authorizing the City Clerk to attest signatures and affix the official seal of the city.

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Request to Approve Homecoming Parade:

Councilwoman Wells made a motion to approve the request for a Homecoming Parade for Forest Park High School. It was seconded by Councilwoman James. Voting for the motion was unanimous.

Request to Approve Contract with InterDev:

Councilwoman Wells made a motion to approve a 6 month contract with InterDev for Technology Services. It was seconded by Councilwoman James. Voting for the motion was unanimous.
