this will allow local government to continue to adopt whatever standards they so deem as appropriate for their communities. The bill is proposing that cities will not be able to adopt any standards at all. It will be preempted by the state. Councilman Mears asked if we adopt this will it still be under all of the state codes and regulations. Mr. Williams stated the standard life safety codes and building codes would apply. This is the legislature where the two bills are primarily aimed at the aesthetics and design guidelines. They are trying to say that cities shouldn't be able allowed to establish those standards.

Councilman Mears made a motion to approve the Resolution. It was seconded by Councilwoman Wells. Voting for the motion was unanimous.

# Intergovernmental Agreement with DDA:

Request was made to approve an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Downtown Development Authority.
